This is a notice under Section 52 of the *Mental Health Act 2007* which requires the applicant for a Community Treatment Order (CTO) to notify the affected person in writing of the application and to provide a copy of the proposed treatment plan.

**A copy of your proposed treatment plan is attached to this notice.**

### Applicant

The above-named person has applied or intends to apply for a Community Treatment Order to be made for you. There will be a hearing with the Mental Health Review Tribunal to consider that application and you are encouraged to attend – that can be in person, by video or by telephone.

The above-named person will advise you of the time and date of the hearing when it has been listed by the Tribunal. You will also receive a letter from the Tribunal which will confirm the time and date of the hearing. Please be aware that **should you choose to not to attend, the hearing may lawfully proceed in your absence.**

### Notice Period

This notice should have been served to you under the following conditions:

Status of recipient	Delivered to you in person or by email	Delivered to you by post
Detained in a mental health facility.	At least 2 days prior to hearing date.	N/A
Under a CTO at the time of this notice.	At least seven days prior to hearing date.	At least seven days plus seven additional working days prior to hearing date.
Not under a CTO at the time of this notice.	At least 15 days prior to hearing date.	At least 14 days plus seven working days prior to hearing date.

### Authorised Applicants

Section 51(2) of the *Mental Health Act 2007* and Part 3 Clause 9 of the *Mental Health Regulations 2019* set out who may apply for a Community Treatment Order. **The applicant of this order is:**

An Authorised Medical Officer of a mental health facility in which a person is detained or is a patient.

A Medical Practitioner who is familiar with the clinical condition of the person.

The Director of Community Treatment of a mental health facility who is familiar with the clinical condition of the person (or Deputy Director delegated under s113 *Mental Health Act 2007*).

The Designated carer or principal care provider of the person.
